Malachi 3:1-5

See, I am sending my messenger to prepare the way before me, and the Lord whom you seek will suddenly come to his temple. The messenger of the covenant in whom you delight—indeed, he is coming, says the Lord of hosts. ²But who can endure the day of his coming, and who can stand when he appears?

For he is like a refiner's fire and like fullers' soap; ³he will sit as a refiner and purifier of silver, and he will purify the descendants of Levi and refine them like gold and silver, until they present offerings to the Lord in righteousness. ^{*} ⁴Then the offering of Judah and Jerusalem will be pleasing to the Lord as in the days of old and as in former years.

⁵ Then I will draw near to you for judgement; I will be swift to bear witness against the sorcerers, against the adulterers, against those who swear falsely, against those who oppress the hired workers in their wages, the widow, and the orphan, against those who thrust aside the alien, and do not fear me, says the Lord of hosts.

O Adonai and Ruler of the house of Israel, you appeared to Moses in the fire of the burning bush, and on Mount Sinai gave him your Law: Come, and with an outstretched arm redeem us!

To ponder

Today's Advent Antiphon is O Adonai – meaning O Lord, Adonai is an ancient title for God often used in the Old Testament as the sacred name of God (known as the Tetragramaton') could not be uttered without it being considered blasphemy. Today's reading from the Prophet Malachi speaks of a messenger who will point the way, show the signs and the Antiphon speaks of the sign of the burning bush indicating the presence of God on the mountain to Moses. In the season of Advent we hear and read of signs, things pointing us in the direction of what is to come – prophets, John the Baptist, angels, Mary's Magnificat. As you have watched, waited and wondered what signs of God's Kingdom have you seen around you?
