## PERSONAL REFLECTION

One theme in the readings for the Third Sunday of Lent is following God's commandments and living them in our hearts.

If you're looking at these materials as a group you're invited to share what that means to you. What does following God's commandments look like to you in how you act in the world, with those you love and those you might class as your enemies.

Proverbs 4.4b (NRSVA) says "Let your heart hold fast my words; keep my commandments, and live." How do you ensure your heart holds fast the words of God, and that God's commandments determine how you live? Psalm 19 speaks of the ways that God's glory is revealed in creation and then speaks of the value of the commandments. Where do you see God in Creation and how does it (or how does it not) help you connect and reflect on God's commandments.

Part of the Scottish Liturgy 1982 is the Summary of the Law: Our Lord Jesus Christ said: The first commandment is this: Hear, O Israel, the Lord our God is the only Lord. You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, with all your soul, with all your mind and with all Your strength." The second is this: "Love your neighbour as yourself." There is no other commandment greater than these. Amen. Lord, have mercy.

Reflecting on Jesus' words and Jesus actions in the temple, what might you be called to do in loving God and loving your neighbour as yourself? Collect for Third Sunday of Lent

Father of mercy, alone we have no power in ourselves to help ourselves. When we are discouraged by our weakness, strengthen us to follow Christ, our pattern and our hope; who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God. now and for ever. Amen.
