CONTEMPLATIVE ACTS - STATIONS OF THE CROSS

Stations of the Cross can be done in church, with stations on the walls or placed in the church, or online with a selection of images or a video.

Stations of the Cross are also known as the Way of the Cross, the Way of Sorrows or *Via Crucis*. They are a series of images which depict Jesus on the day of his crucifixion, with accompanying readings and prayers.

The stations arose from pilgrims to Jerusalem and walking the way of the *Via Dolorosa*. There are traditions of a service on Good Friday or through Lent, with in church and online versions available.

The stations encourage reflection on the Passion of Jesus, seeing images from the Gospels and a way to engage visually with the events on the day of Jesus' death.

Collect for the Fifth Sunday of Lent

Most merciful God, by the death and resurrection of your Son Jesus Christ you created humanity anew. May the power of his victorious cross transform those who turn in faith to him who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever. Amen.

Stations of the Cross

There are different numbers of stations and different depictions but one common form (with scriptural references) is:

- 1. Jesus in the Garden of Gethsemane (Matthew 26:36-41)
- 2. Jesus is betrayed by Judas and arrested (Mark 14:43-46)
- 3. Jesus is condemned by the Sanhedrin (Luke 22:66-71)
- 4. Jesus is denied by Peter (Matthew 26:69-75)
- 5. Jesus is judged by Pilate (Mark 15:1-5, 15)
- 6. Jesus is scourged and crowned with thorns (John 19:1-3)
- 7. Jesus takes up his cross (John 19:6, 15-17)
- 8. Jesus is helped by Simon to carry his cross (Mark 15:21)
- 9. Jesus meets the women of Jerusalem (Luke 23:27-31)
- 10. Jesus is crucified (Luke 23:33-34)
- 11. Jesus promises his kingdom to the repentant thief (Luke 23:39-43)
- 12. Jesus entrusts Mary and John to each other (John 19:25-27)
- 13. Jesus dies on the cross (Luke 23:44-46)
- 14. Jesus is laid in the tomb (Matthew 27:57-60)
