Scriptures exhorts us to pray for all those in authority, and voting is part of our responsibility as Christians as we seek to be Salt and Light in this world.

Some Key Dates and Information

- Deadline for applying for a postal vote, 17:00 on 19 June (this can be done online: https://www.gov.uk/apply-postal-vote)
- Deadline for applying for a proxy vote, 17:00 on 26 June
- Deadline for applying for a Voter Authority Certificate, 17:00 on 26 June

Polling day is on Thursday 4 July, between 07:00 – 22:00.

The electoral commission (https://www.electoralcommission.org.uk/) has resources on how to vote, voter ID and other information for voters.

The Orkney and Shetland constituency remains the same, however, all the other Westminster constituencies in the Diocese have had boundary changes with some name changes. All this we beg for the sake of our Lord and Saviour, Jesus Christ. *Amen*.
