CONTEMPLATIVE ACTS - THY KINGDOM COME

This week's contemplative act is considering the Lord's Prayer, praying for others to come to know Jesus and reflecting on different prayer practices.

The Season between Ascension and Pentecost is a season of waiting. The risen Jesus has ascended to heaven and we are waiting for the gift of the Holy Spirit.

The 11 days between Ascension and Pentecost are when the ecumenical prayer movement 'Thy Kingdom Come' happens. This is a global ecumenical prayer movement that invites Christians around the world to pray from Ascension to Pentecost for more people to come to know Jesus.

The movement, since May 2016 and now in over 80 countries, encourages every person, household and church to pray during the 11 days in their own way

Archbishop Justin Welby says that "In praying 'Thy Kingdom Come' we all commit to playing our part in the renewal of the nations and the transformation of communities."

Resources are made available – for different age groups, a prayer journal. a prayer Novena, resources in Gaelic and English, videos and others suggestions for prayer practices, including prayer stations. These are free to download from https://www.thykingdomcome.global/prayer-resources.

Collect for the Seventh Sunday of Easter

- Commit to praying the Lords Prayer at the same time each day
- Try a new prayer practice, perhaps one from a previous Thursday of this course or return to one of the suggestions to try it again or because it connected with you.
- Look at different versions of the Lords Prayer, what do they highlight for you, what do they make you reflect on and encourage you to pray for in the life of the world, your family and friends and your community.
