For pieces of music with words, listen to the words (or look them up), do these resonate with you and what do they make you think of in relation to this Easter and the Resurrection of Christ?



The image above is a wood engraving illustration for an edition of John Bunyan's *The Pilgrim's Progress*. The story is a Christian allegory published in 1678 and is regarded as one of the most significant works in English Literature. It tells the story of a man's journey through considering sin, salvation and life. The second part (for which the above illustration was produced) tells of the pilgrimage of Christian's wife, Christiana, and their sons, and the maiden, Mercy. The lit up place is the Celestial City.
