Scripture: **Revelation 4:10-11**

The twenty-four elders fall down before him who is seated on the throne and worship him who lives forever and ever. They cast their crowns before the throne, saying, “Worthy are you, our Lord and God, to receive glory and honor and power, for you created all things, and by your will they existed and were created.”

Reflection

Crowns are often a feature at Epiphany. In Poland people wear paper crowns on processions, Spain has King Cake where a miniature crown is hidden inside and sometimes the C, M and B when chalking doors have crowns on top of them. There is a direct relationship between Jesus, King of Kings and the crown of thorns, reminding us of the reason for the incarnation, that God With Us came to earth so that the events of Holy Week and Easter might happen.
