From Christian Aid:

Christian Aid works with local partners and crisis-affected communities on the causes and consequences of climate change, so the most marginalised can adapt, build resilience and reduce their vulnerability.

We focus on climate resilient agriculture, climate finance, loss and damage restoration and climate information services and early warning systems.

At its core, our climate work stems from our belief that change is possible. Communities should be able to live with dignity, respond effectively to climate-related disasters, risks and opportunities, and build thriving resilient livelihoods. Resilience should be both a continual capacity-strengthening process – enhancing the ability of individuals and communities to anticipate, organise for and adapt to change and an end goal.
